


USE THESE AS WARM-UPS OR SCENE STARTERS. SET A TIMER FOR 10 MINUTES AND WRITE WITHOUT STOPPING.

5 CREATIVE EXERCISES

100-Word Scene

Write a complete scene using exactly 100 words. Force yourself to trim the fluff and focus on impact.

<u>Dialogue-Only</u> <u>Challenge</u>

Write a scene using only dialogue—no tags, no narration. Can your readers still follow who's who?



<u>Describe Without</u> <u>Naming</u>

Write a paragraph describing a common object (like a candle, suitcase, or mug) without saying what it is. Let the details reveal it.

Character Switcheroo

Write a scene from your current work-in-progress—but through the eyes of a different character.

<u>Stream of</u> <u>Consciousness</u>

Set a timer for 5 minutes and write whatever comes to mind. Don't edit, don't stop, don't censor. Just go.

5 MINDSET SHIFTS TO OVERCOME BLOCK



1. Write Bad on Purpose

Perfection is the enemy of progress. Try to write the worst version of your next scene. You'll surprise yourself.

2. You're Not Behind

Time spent thinking, plotting, or daydreaming is part of the process. You're not late—you're percolating.

3. Progress = Practice

Every word you write—even the ones you delete—makes you a stronger writer. It's all part of the training.

4. Take the Pressure Off

Not everything you write has to be part of a novel. Let yourself play, experiment, and make messes.


5. Reset the Mood

Change your environment. Write by hand. Light a candle. Try ambient noise. A small shift can refresh your mind.
